BONHAMS SUPPORTS THE CURE PARKINSON'S TRUST

More than 50 artists have created artworks inside Perspex
boxes to raise money for the charity

Bonhams has joined forces with Artwise and the David Ross Foundation to launch Cure3, a new annual art project to raise money for The Cure Parkinson's Trust, whose research aims to find a cure for Parkinson's disease. The project has seen 53 internationally renowned artists create unique artworks inside a bespoke Perspex box measuring 20 centimetres cubed.

Conrad Shaweross' sculptural metallic design, Polly Morgan's taxidermy creation and Rob and Nick Carter's whimsical box of butterflies are among the highly collectable artworks in the exhibition, with other artists in the high-profile line-up including Damien Hirst, Jake and Dinos Chapman, Rose Wylie and Yinka Shonibare.
